- 5. Your camera bubble will appear on screen.
- 6. Click **Start recording**.
- 7. Present your slides while the recorder captures:
  - Your screen
  - Your voice
  - Your face (in the bubble)
- 8. When done, stop recording.
- 9. Loom gives you a **shareable video link** and a **download option**.
